Our approach encourages youth to:


- Identify community problems.

11. The Struggles of African Youth – A Continental Reality

12. Stories of Youth Abuse and Violation Across the Continent

The injustices faced by African youth are not abstract — they are real, painful, and often shocking. Countless young people endure abuse in various forms, including:

1. Political Violence and Suppression

In several African countries, youth activists are harassed, threatened, detained, or even killed for speaking out. Governments and security forces sometimes view outspoken youth as a threat rather than partners in development. This results in:

- Arbitrary arrests of student leaders
- Violent crackdowns on peaceful protests
- Intimidation and torture of youth advocating for reform

2. Gender-Based Violence

Young girls and women face:

- Sexual assault
- Forced child marriages
- Domestic violence
- Exploitation at workplaces

Many survivors remain silent due to fear, stigma, and lack of safe reporting systems.

3. Economic Exploitation

Millions of youths are trapped in low-wage jobs, unsafe working environments, or exploitative labour practices. Some engage in dangerous informal work because of limited opportunities.

4. Human Trafficking and Migration Abuse

Many young Africans attempting to migrate for better opportunities face abuse from traffickers, smugglers, or border authorities. Some lose their lives in deserts, seas, or detention centres.

5. Abuse Based on Identity and Orientation

This includes ethnic discrimination, xenophobia, and severe persecution of LGBTQ+ youth.

These abuses reveal gaps in governance, human rights protection, and youth inclusion across the continent.

13. The Hidden Suffering of LGBTQ+ Youth in Africa

While many African countries promote tolerance and unity, LGBTQ+ youth still face harrowing realities. In countries such as Zimbabwe, Uganda, Nigeria, and others, laws and social attitudes make life extremely difficult and often dangerous for queer young people.

LGBTQ+ youth face:

- **Physical torture** by community members, families, or authorities
- **Corrective rape**, especially targeted at lesbians and transgender individuals
- **Forced conversion practices** disguised as religious or traditional rituals
- **Expulsion from homes**, leaving youth homeless and vulnerable
- **Blackmail and extortion**
- **Verbal and emotional abuse**
- **Police brutality and arbitrary arrests**

- **Denial of healthcare** due to stigma



Many Zimbabwean LGBTQ+ youth live in fear daily. Some are beaten, tortured, or detained simply for being who they are. Often, their stories stay hidden because they cannot report abuse without risking further persecution.

14. One Voice Youth Foundation – A Rescue for the Vulnerable

In response to the suffering of marginalized youth, especially LGBTQ+ youth fleeing persecution, ONE VOICE Youth Foundation established a **safe-house shelter in South Africa**. This shelter provides refuge for young people escaping violence, torture, and discrimination.

Our Shelter Provides:

- **Emergency accommodation** for victims of violence and discrimination
- **Food, clothing, and medical support**
- **Trauma counselling** and mental health services
- **Legal assistance**, especially for asylum seekers and refugees
- **Reintegration programs**, including education and skills development

- **A supportive community** where youth feel seen, heard, and valued

Our shelter has become a lifeline for many Zimbabwean LGBTQ+ youth who flee torture, blackmail, or death threats. South Africa, although still facing challenges of its own, offers stronger legal protections and social support systems compared to their home countries.

15. Real-Life Stories of Resilience and Survival

Story 1: The Young Dancer from Harare

A 19-year-old Zimbabwean dancer was attacked by neighbours who accused him of "bringing shame" to the community because of his sexual orientation. He was beaten, tied up, and left unconscious. After escaping, he crossed into South Africa and was housed at our shelter. Today, he is rebuilding his life, attending dance workshops, and receiving psychosocial support.

Story 2: The Girl Forced Into "Corrective" Abuse

A young lesbian woman from Bulawayo was subjected to violent "corrective rape" by relatives who believed this would "fix" her. Traumatized and fearing for her life, she fled to South Africa. ONE VOICE Youth Foundation welcomed her into our care, helped her access therapy, and supported her asylum application.

Story 3: The Transgender Teen Rejected by Family

A 17-year-old transgender youth was kicked out by family members who burned their clothes and personal items. The teen lived on the streets for weeks before finding support through activists who referred them to our shelter. With our help, they are now accessing healthcare and pursuing education.

These stories represent only a fraction of the suffering that LGBTQ+ youth endure across Africa.

16. The Wider Impact of Youth Abuse

When youth suffer, entire communities suffer. The impacts of abuse and marginalization include:

- Increased homelessness
- Rising suicide rates

- Broken families and stigma
- High school dropout rates
- Trauma and long-term mental health struggles
- Reduced economic participation
- Weakening of social cohesion

By protecting vulnerable youth, we protect the future of Africa. Youth who are safe, supported, and respected are more likely to contribute positively to society.
